

## Distinguished Faculty Service Award

“The Class of 1991 Distinguished Faculty Service Award, our most prestigious faculty recognition, was created by grateful alumni to honor each year one member of our faculty. To be eligible, an individual must be a full-time member of the faculty, and nominations may be submitted by students, alumni, and colleagues.

The Distinguished Faculty Service Award is given to an individual who has, over a sustained period of time, demonstrated characteristics of the most outstanding faculty – intellectual vitality, instructional excellence, effective communication skills, the ability to motivate or inspire, compassion and concern for student success, collegiality, and leadership. That is, someone whose commitment to, and passion for, educational excellence is without bound and unquenchable.
