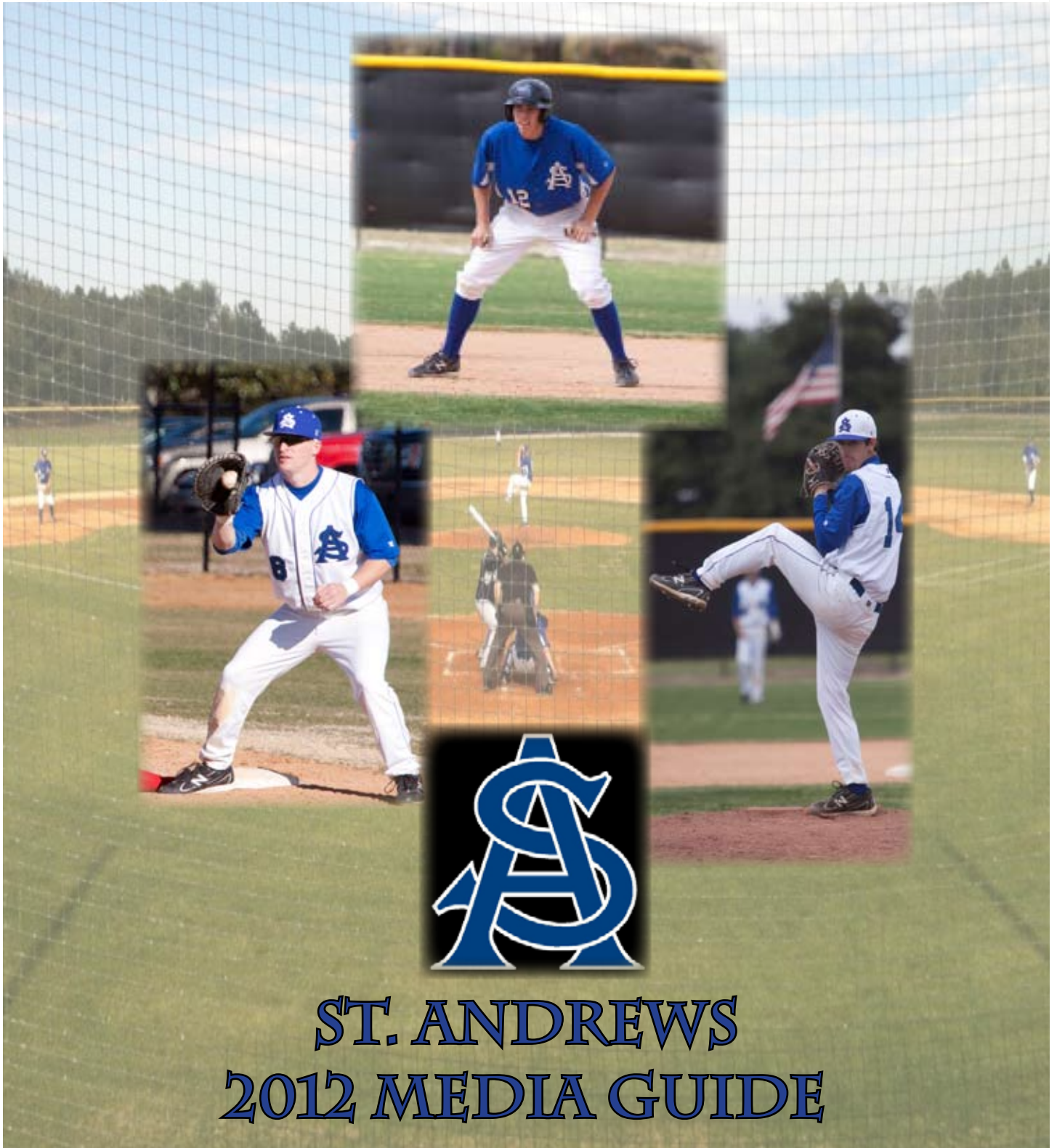

# COACH'S BIOGRAPHY

## MATT BOYKIN

Matt Boykin enters his second season as the head baseball coach at St. Andrews after being hired in the summer of 2010.

After only one season, Boykin is dramatically increasing the size of the baseball program at St. Andrews. Not only is he bringing in players for the varsity team, but the up coming season will mark the start of a JV team for Knights Baseball.

Boykin joined the SA athletics department after spending six years as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I Appalachian State University in Boone, N.C. After a very successful tenure at ASU, Boykin was rewarded with his first head coaching position when he came to St. Andrews and returned to the league where he played collegiate baseball.



Boykin was an integral component of the Appalachian State baseball coaching staff, helping in all aspects of the program including recruiting coordinator, primary hitting & infield instructor, third base coach, strength & conditioning, practices, and compliance. Mountaineer fans witnessed a transformation in the baseball program in his six seasons at ASU. Boykin helped guide ASU from a 10-43 season with a 261 RBI rating in 2004 (year before his arrival to Boone) to a 38-18-1 record with RPI rating of 50 in his final season of 2010. The 38 wins last year were the second-most in school history and the fourth consecutive 30-plus win season for ASU.

Boykin coached nine MLB draft picks in his tenure at Appalachian State. The institution did not have any draft picks for the decade prior to his arrival at ASU. Boykin also instructed 12 All-Conference and four All-Americans.

The Apex, N.C., product played four seasons at Conference Carolinas rival Barton College (Wilson, N.C.). Boykin was a two-time Academic All-Conference and All-Tournament honoree for the Bulldogs before earning a pair of bachelor's degrees in business administration and sports management from Barton in 2003. Boykin added master's degree in sports coaching from the United States Sports Academy in 2005.

In addition to spending the 2004 season as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Boykin was the head coach of the Asheboro Copperheads of the Coastal Plain League and served as an assistant coach with the CPL's Wilson Tobs in 2004. He has also gained experience working at several camps throughout the Southeast and has been an assistant coach for American Legion squads in Wilson and Apex, N.C. Boykin currently resides in Laurinburg.

# ASSISTANT COACHES' BIOGRAPHIES

## JASON KUHN

Jason Kuhn is starting his second season at St. Andrews, after being hired in the summer of 2010 as an assistant coach for the baseball program.

Coach Kuhn has spent the majority of his time at St. Andrews working with the pitchers in the program. This year, in addition to being a pitching coach, Kuhn will be the Head Coach of the JV team that the program is starting this year.

Kuhn made his way to St. Andrews after attending James Madison University (Harrisonburg, VA) for his undergraduate degree. As a student-athlete at JMU, the left-handed pitcher was a valuable addition to the Dukes. Kuhn and his teammates were able to out-play the competition in 2008 and took home a Conference title. Coach Kuhn's collegiate play earned him such honors as CAA Pitcher of the Week and Ping! Baseball Spotlight Performance of the week.

The Eagle Scout completed his studies at James Madison University in 2010 and holds a B.A. in History. Kuhn currently resides in Laurinburg.



## DREW ROBERTS

Drew Roberts is entering his second season as part of the St. Andrews staff, after being hired as an assistant coach for the Knights baseball program under Head Coach Matt Boykin in 2010.

Roberts came to St. Andrews from Ohio University (Athens, OH) where he gained experience by being a volunteer coach while attending graduate school. Also, during the summer of 2010, Roberts served as the head coach for Edmonton Prospects- Western Major Baseball League's summer collegiate team. Roberts also has recent coaching experience with the Great Lakes Collegiate Baseball League and the Cincinnati Six Amateur Baseball Organization.

As a student-athlete, Roberts played at Xavier University (Cincinnati, OH) on an athletic scholarship. During his collegiate career, he was chosen as the Atlantic 10 Conference Player of the Week Award multiple times and was also picked as the 2003 Preseason Atlantic 10 Rookie of the year.

Roberts holds a B.A. in Public Relations from Xavier University and recently finished an M.A. in Coaching Education at Ohio University. He currently resides in Laurinburg.

# WHAT'S NEW ON THE DIAMOND?

St. Andrews University will begin its second season under Head Coach Matt Boykin with great optimism. Coming off a season that yielded a record of 8-36, the coaching staff and players have dedicated themselves to getting St. Andrews baseball back on track. An immediate difference in this year's club is the roster size. With having 17 eligible players all of last season, the Knights will enter the 2012 season with a roster size well over 30 players. Among these players is a small but strong group of returners that have a great amount of playing experience among them. In addition to this group, 11 transfers and 9 freshmen will round out the roster.

The Knights will return the most experience on the mound. Junior Ryan Pierce proved to be one of the league's top starters last season; posting under a 3.00 ERA in conference starts. Pierce started every conference weekend and kept the team in every game he pitched. Junior John Allen Renn and sophomore Joe McCarty are returning members of the SAU bull-pen. Both returners were called upon regularly in tough situations last season, which will help prepare them for a variety of roles this season. Junior Andrew Pelfrey, who also plays soccer for the Knights, also returns on the mound with over 77 innings pitched last season that included two complete game victories. Senior Jake Anderson and sophomore Sebastian Ray are the top returning position players for the Knights. Anderson had a good season at the plate batting over .300, but really excelled behind the plate; proving to be very valuable in the handling of our pitching staff as well as limiting the running game from opponents. Ray returns after a strong freshman year in which he hit in the middle of the line-up for the entire season. With that experience and success, St. Andrews will look to Ray to provide a consistent presence in the middle of the Knights' line-up once again. Another piece to the line-up will be returning senior TJ Werner. TJ returns as the top power hitter for the Knights, notching 17 doubles.

Complementing the returners is a solid cast of newcomers. Junior P/1B Travis Holland is expected to provide leadership to both the pitching staff as well as the line-up. Holland's experience at the Junior College level has prepared him to come in and be a strong presence for the Knights on the weekends. Fellow transfers Matt McCue and Mike Durig will also elevate the Knights' talent level with their two-way abilities. McCue brings a very athletic approach to this team as a CF/LHP. His abilities will not only help the Knights to score and prevent runs, but he will also be called upon in late innings as a valuable relief pitcher. Mike Durig will provide power to the line-up in addition to being used in a variety of roles on the mound. Durig's competitive attitude will also help to shape the personality of this team. The team will also rely on several freshmen to step in and fill some valuable roles. Chris Denno, Matt Beauchemin, and Kyle Schade will be looked upon to throw valuable innings for the Knights this year. Beauchemin and Schade, along with fellow freshman Tyler Nolan, will also be asked to provide offensive help as well.

With these pieces in place, St. Andrews is poised to rebound from a couple of down seasons to be much more competitive this season. Complimenting the talent and depth that this team possesses is their character. Returning players Ethan Powell and Chris Constantine demonstrate this very well showing dedication to the program on and off the field through standout academics, great leadership, and have a tremendous ability to show others what it takes to be a champion. This group is full of hard workers and high character kids that come from good families. The players' dedication to being student-athletes was shown when the squad achieved a team GPA of 3.0 in the fall semester.
