# COACH'S BIOGRAPHY

## ROHAN NARAIN

Rohan Naraine enters his second season with the Lady Knights after being named the head coach of the St. Andrews women's soccer team in May of 2010.

Naraine joined the St. Andrews athletics department after successfully accumulating a 48-29-7 (.613) record at Coastal Carolina University including a school-record 15 wins in 2007. In his four seasons at CCU, Naraine produced a 23-8-2 (.727) league record; captured two Big South Conference Championships (2007, 2008); and made two Big South Conference Tournament finals appearances.

The 2007 Big South Conference Coach of the Year has developed a successful balance of athletics and academics with his student-athletes at Coastal Carolina. Naraine's squads have earned academic awards (3.0-plus GPA) in every season he has been at the helm of the Chanticleers women's soccer program.

Naraine coached a total of six years in Conway, S.C., having served as an assistant women's soccer coach at Coastal Carolina in the 2002 and 2005 seasons.

Between his first two stints at CCU, Naraine spent two years as the inaugural head coach of the fledgling Southern University women's soccer program in Baton Rouge, La.

The Guyana native has nearly 25 years of coaching experience at all levels including high school, collegiate, and international levels. Naraine's first collegiate head coaching job was at another Conference Carolinas (formally CVAC) member institution, Coker College. Naraine directed the Lady Cobras for four seasons (1998-2001) before taking a shot at the Division I ranks.

After spending most of his youth in England, Naraine came to the United States and attended North Carolina Wesleyan College (Rocky Mount, N.C.). The talented futbol player was a team-captain and All-Region honoree, while leading the Battling Bishops to the NCAA Division III National Tournament in 1984. After his playing career came to an end due to injury, Naraine started his remarkable coaching career as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's soccer programs at NC Wesleyan.

Naraine has served as a staff member of the men's and women's Guyana National Teams that compete in the CONCACAF region. In 1999, he was chosen to the coaching staff of Guyana's Men's Soccer Olympic Soccer Team. Naraine holds a FIFA Olympic License along with his NSCAA National Coaching License.

Naraine and his wife, Naline, currently reside in Florence, S.C., with their one daughter, Nikki.

# WHAT'S HAPPENING ON THE FIELD?

The St. Andrews women's soccer team is planning for a competitive season, at both the intercollegiate level and the inter-squad level. Coach Naraine's dedication to recruiting has produced a lot of depth in the roster with a total number of 24 players.

The 2011-2012 squad will be a young team, since Coach Naraine graduated seven seniors from last year's team. After his first season as head coach (2010-2011), Naraine and the Lady Knights made an appearance in the Conference Carolinas tournament. Despite the graduation of numerous experienced players, the high number of athletes on the roster this season will lead to the girls having to constantly play to the best of their ability to earn a starting position. While the majority of the team members are in their beginning years of collegiate play, there will be four seniors on the field for the Knights this season. Coach Naraine expects that many of his freshman and transfers will step up and earn starting positions to help the soccer program succeed this fall. Naraine anticipates a strong defense, a solid midfield, and quick forwards who will all work together to put up points for the Knights and keep opponents from scoring.

The Lady Knights are making it a team goal to return to the Conference Carolinas tournament again this fall. Even though this goal will require a lot of hard work and perseverance, the Lady Knights are up for the challenge. The team will look to the seven returning starters from last season for strong leadership. The skilled returners and the strong recruiting class aim to come together and make their way up the leader board to secure a spot in the conference tournament. The ladies must place at least 8th in the conference after the regular season in order to make it to the tournament.

Conference play in 2011 will be tough due to the addition of two more teams this year, making a total of 13. Despite the size of the conference, Coach Naraine believes that the Lady Knights will step up to the challenge and grab one of the top eight spots.

Coach Naraine says, "It will be an exciting year for us! We will learn a lot about our team during the three scrimmage games at the beginning of the season that will help prepare us for conference play. The fall 2011 season will be a tough and challenging one, but also an exciting one. The tough schedule will challenge our players and will help our team grow and get stronger to help build a good future for women's soccer at St. Andrews."
